RE: Counties Need Immediate Clarification on Vaccine Distribution for Farmworkers

Dear Dr. Aragón:

We continue to hear from our counties, labor advocates, and agricultural growers of mounting concerns about the inconsistent and insufficient vaccine distribution across our state for farmworkers. Despite classification as essential workers and prioritization in the state's vaccination plan, farmworkers—except in isolated cases¹—are simply not receiving the vaccine. We believe this is because counties are not exercising their discretion to release vaccine supply to this vulnerable population. We therefore request that CDPH immediately provide clarification and guidance to the state's top agricultural counties, which we represent, on vaccine distribution for priority tiers. Please make clear to these agricultural counties that they can and should be allocating vaccines to farmworkers.

A recent University of California, San Francisco study revealed that farmworkers are contracting and dying of COVID-19 at alarming, disproportionate rates.² Despite this, we hear that in many counties that have begun vaccinating individuals in Phase 1B, mass vaccination sites and clinics are only open to those age 65 and older. The most commonly cited reasons for excluding farmworkers from vaccination sites are supply limits and lack of clarification from the state on vaccine distribution for priority tiers. To address this inconsistency, we request that you immediately clarify the guidelines on vaccine distribution for priority groups to the county health officers from the following agricultural counties, which we represent and are home to the vast majority of our state's farmworkers: Kern, Tulare, Fresno, Monterey, Stanislaus, Merced, San Joaquin, Ventura, Kings, Imperial, Madera, San Diego, Santa Barbara, Riverside, and Sonoma.

We stand ready to work with you to ensure farmworkers receive the vaccine as soon as possible, so that we can save lives. We would appreciate a response within one week of your receipt of this

letter, confirming that these counties have received clarification and guidance related to this issue. If we are going to designate farmworkers as a prioritized group, it is critical we do all we can to treat them as such and ensure they actually receive the vaccine.
